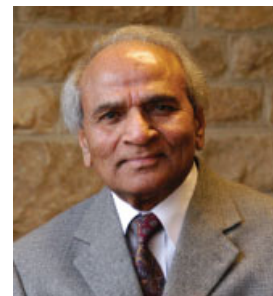
Regardless of our diverse specialties, research agenda, and institutional affiliation, the goal is only one, that is, to improve the quality of patient care related to vascular diseases. The
